


Figure 3. Weekly news coverage of for-profits from November 2009 through April 2010





Figure 4. Weekly news coverage of for-profits from May 2010 through December 2010






Figure 4. Weekly news coverage of for-profits from May 2010 through December 2010




Figure 4. Weekly news coverage of for-profits from May 2010 through December 2010




Figure 4. Weekly news coverage of for-profits from May 2010 through December 2010






Figure 4. Weekly news coverage of for-profits from May 2010 through December 2010



Media Coverage of Pending Gainful Employment Regulations




In Favor of Proposed Regulations

Before GE Regulations Issued: Quality of Source of Stories in Opposition




After GE Regulations Published

Proportion of Pro Versus Con




Non-GE Coverage: Jan. 1 to Aug 31, 2011




Non-GE Coverage: Quality of Source (Negative) Jan. 1 to Aug. 31, 2011




Breakdown of Positive Stories Jan. 1 to Aug. 31, 2011

- U.S. Government Policy That Encourages Excessive Student Indebtedness
 - 90/10
 - Professional Judgment Limitations
- How the Credit Crunch Has Contributes to Excessive Student Indebtedness
- Student Loan Fraud Related to Student Credit Balances



Government Policy Encouraging Excessive Indebtedness

- Applies only to the proprietary sector
- Compels increase in tuition to ensure receipt of non-Title IV funds
- Difficulty of forcing cash payment from low-income demographic



Government Policy Encouraging Excessive Indebtedness • Professional Judgment Limitation:


- Determination on a case by case basis
- Documentation of reason for the denial or reduction
- Provision of reason for the denial or reduction in writing to the student
- Not discriminatory on the basis of race, national origin, religion, sex, marital status, age, or disability status.

Legislative Efforts

- Federal:
 - Harkin, Carper & Webb will introduce legislation to:
 - Turn 90-10 to 85-15
 - Include military/veteran benefits in 85 side of calculation
 - Reinstate 50% rule
 - House Bill:
 - Eliminate Pell eligibility for less than 1/2 time students
 - Reduce Pell eligibility from 18 to 12 semesters (9 to 6 years)
 - Change AGI from \$30,000 to \$15,000 to qualify for "auto zero"
 - Eliminate Pell eligibility for ATB students
- State:
 - 23 states have introduced 54 bills aimed at proprietary sector to:
 - Limit state spending on sector
 - Increase oversight
 - Require more disclosures about costs and outcomes
 - Includes TX, CA, IL, OK, AL, ID, UT, IA, MA, ND, NY, MD, WV, OH



Efforts in Judiciary

- Federal
 - For the first time, US DOJ Intervenes in *Qui Tam* action against proprietary chain; MN, CA, FL, IL, and IN join suit
- State
 - KY AG has sued 3 proprietary chains
 - NC AG has initiated investigation
 - NY AG investigating 4 publicly traded proprietary chains
 - Publicly traded chain has agreed to \$40 million settlement in CA
 - TWC announced revocation of license of proprietary chain
 - Multi-state litigation effort



Executive Efforts

- Department of Defense:
 - 1/2012 DOD will require distance ed programs receiving military/vet tuition assistance programs to submit to MIVERs
- Department of Education:
 - 2012 Neg Reg:
 - Changes to total and permanent disability discharge requirements
 - Make Direct Loan regulations stand alone (w/o cross reference to FFEL)
 - Changes to IBR and ICR
 - Additional topics suggested by public at hearings:
 - Improvements of DL servicing
 - Simplify origination process
 - Change graduation rate formula
 - Carry out obligation to reduce regulatory burden
 - Remove rehabilitated loans from CDR calculation



Windows of Opportunity

- House Appropriations Committee Bill Defunds:
 - Gainful employment regulations
 - State authorization regulations
 - Regulations defining Credit Hour
- January 2011 Executive Order
 - Requires federal agency review of burdensome regulations
